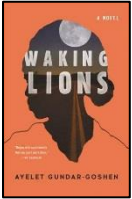


SISTERHOOD TORAH FUND BOOK CLUB 2017-2018

Facilitated by Rachel Kamin, CLC Director

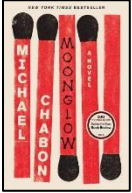

***Waking Lions* by Ayelet Gundar-Goshen**

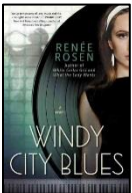

***Moonglow* by Michael Chabon**

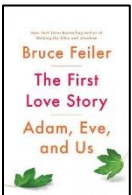
A man bears witness to his grandfather's deathbed confessions, which reveal his family's long-buried history and his involvement in a mail-order novelty company, World War II, and the space program.

***Windy City Blues* by Renee Rosen**

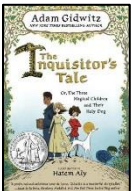

***The First Love Story* by Bruce Feiler**

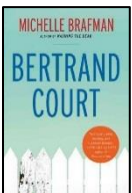
