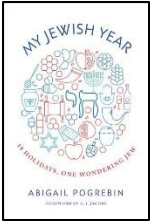


SISTERHOOD TORAH FUND BOOK CLUB 2018-2019

Facilitated by Rachel Kamin, CLC Director

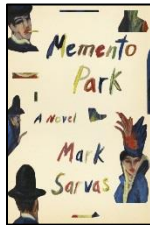

***Three Floors Up* by Eshkol Nevo**

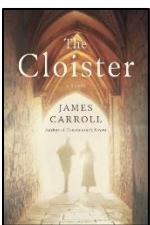

***Refugee* by Alan Gratz**

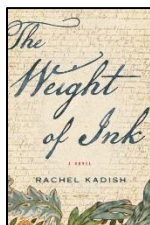

***The Cloister* by James Carroll**

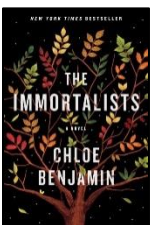
