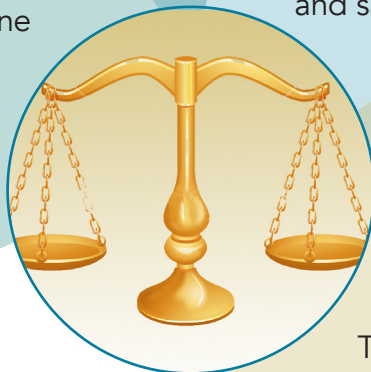
## Young Moses Torah Study

G-d sees abilities in young Moses that mark him to be a leader.

What are they?

**Torah: Exodus 2:11-17**

I. Some time after that - when Moses had grown up - he went out to his people and witnessed their labors. He saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew, one of his people. He turned this way and that and - seeing no one around - he struck down the Egyptian and hid him in the sand.



II. When [Moses] went out the next day, he found two Hebrews fighting. He said to the offender, "Why do you strike your fellow?" [The Hebrew] retorted, "Who made you chief and ruler over us? Do you mean to kill me as you killed the Egyptian?" Moses was frightened and thought, Indeed the matter is known! When Pharaoh learned of the matter, he sought to kill Moses; but Moses fled from Pharaoh. He settled in the land of Midian, and sat down beside a well.

III. Now the priest of Midian had seven daughters. They came to draw water and filled the troughs to water their father's flock. But shepherds came and drove them off. Moses rose to their defense, and he watered their flock.

>> *What leadership lessons do we learn from Moses, either here or elsewhere in the Passover story?*

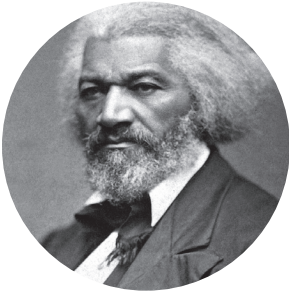
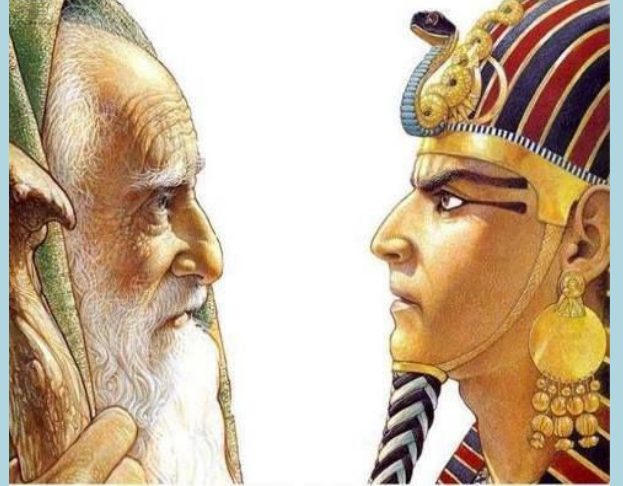

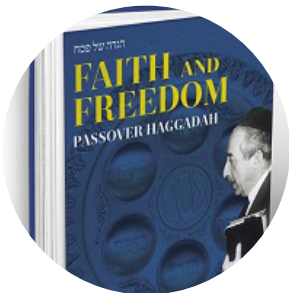
