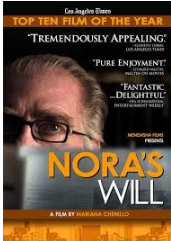


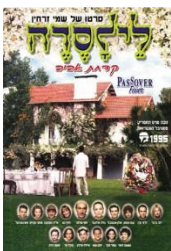
For Your Passover Viewing Pleasure:

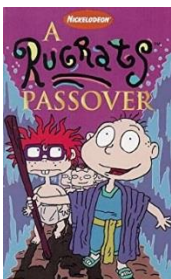
Passover Fever

The animated feature from Dreamworks that dramatically retells the story of Moses. Available from Comcast, [Amazon Prime](#) and other streaming services.



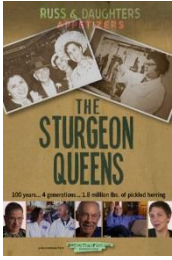
A Rugrats Passover

For more than 90 years, the Streit's matzo factory sat in a low-slung tenement building on Manhattan's Lower East Side. While other matzo companies modernized, Streit's remained a piece of living history, churning out 40 percent of the nation's unleavened bread on pre-War machinery as old as the factory itself. 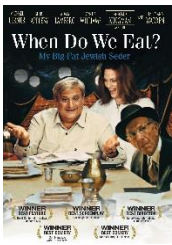
The Sturgeon Queens

Produced to coincide with the 100th anniversary of Russ and Daughters, a Lower East Side lox and herring emporium, this documentary includes six colorful longtime customers sitting around a table reading the script in the style of a Passover Seder. The Ten Commandments

Passover is the perfect time to enjoy this 1956 American epic produced, directed, and narrated by Cecil B. DeMille and starring Charlton Heston, Yul Brynner, and Anne Baxter. Filmed on location in Egypt, Mount Sinai and the Sinai Peninsula, it features one of the largest sets ever created for a film and, at the time of its release, was the most expensive film ever made. It is also one of the most financially successful, grossing approximately \$122.7 million (equivalent to \$1.15 billion today) at the box office.
