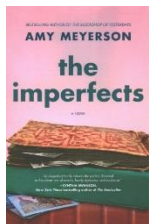


SISTERHOOD TORAH FUND BOOK CLUB 2020-2021

Facilitated by Rachel Kamin, CLC Director

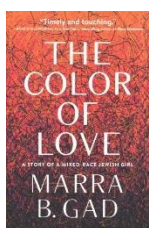

***The Imperfects* by Amy Meyerson**

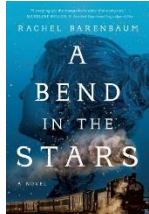

***The Color of Love: A Story of a Mixed-Race Jewish Girl* by Marra B. Gad**

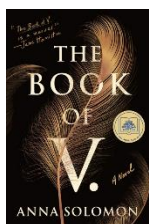

***A Bend in the Stars* by Rachel Barenbaum**

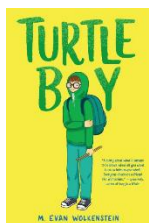
