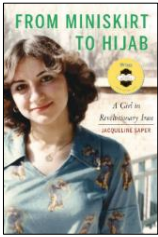

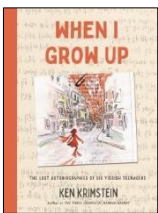

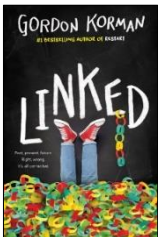
ARTIST TALK: WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 8, 7:00 PM

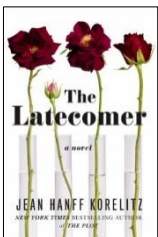

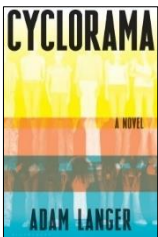


The Latecomer by Jean Hanff Korelitz
