Through hands-on activities relating to Holiday and Shabbat observances, Jewish symbols, Torah, Israel and Mitzvot, students learn what it means to be a Jew through the lens of the home, the family and the synagogue. Judaic curriculum focuses on Project Etgar, My Family Story and Moving Traditions.

- o **MY FAMILY STORY** is a family root research project that has students use their creative skills to design an original, artistic display that captures the essence of their family history.
- o **MOVING TRADITIONS** B'nai Mitzvah program is a new model of Jewish education for students and parents that speaks directly to the psychological, spiritual, social, and developmental issues that pre-teens face as they prepare for and celebrate the rite of passage.

Vav students are required to attend 6 Shabbat morning services during the year in the main sanctuary to acquaint families with flow of the main service as prep for their B'nai Mitzvah.
