

GUIDELINES FOR WINTER HATS AND SCARVES

Free patterns are available on the websites of many yarn brands, including <https://www.yarnspirations.com> and <https://lionsbrand.com/lander>.

Specifications:

- Washable yarn (acrylic or wool) – knit or crochet, any color, any pattern
- Adult scarf dimensions: dark colors, 8" x 70"
- Child/preteen scarf dimensions: bright colors, 8" x 50"

Hints when creating scarves:

- Measure from end-to-end. Do not include (optional) fringe in measurement.
- Knit a rib or seed stitch pattern for the first two inches (such as K2, P2, repeat across; do opposite on back side: P2, K2, repeat across). Prevent "rolling" by knitting an edging border vertically: Knit first four stitches and last four stitches of each row.
- A suggestion from Judy Weiss for an easy crocheted scarf: Use thinner yarn and a size 6mm crochet hook and cast on 27 stitches. <https://search.app/NW4G1vTgbcpTeM9x9>

CROCHETED SUZETTE SCARF - (takes 3 hours) from Hooked by Robin

You can use any yarn and hook you would like. What Robin used below:

3 x Balls of Scheepjes Namaste Yarn

9mm crochet Hook

The weight and drape of the yarn make it quite stretchy so hard to measure. My scarf is approximately 6 inches (15cm) wide and 87 inches (220cm) long.

Abbreviations:

Ch = Chain

SC= Single Crochet

DC = Double Crochet

St = Stitch

[] For any stitches inside these brackets, you will place them all in the same stitch/space.

START: Chain an even number to create the width you would like.

I chained 16 for my scarf.

Row 1: SC in the 2nd Ch from hook. SC in each Ch across.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn work.

(SC, DC) into first st.

Repeat * Skip 1 st. (SC, DC) into next st. * until last 2 sts.

Sk 1 st, SC in last st.

Repeat Row 2 until you reach the length you desire. Feel free to change colour, on any row that you want.

Final Row: Ch 1, turn work.

SC into first st.

SC in each st across.

Tie off.

Weave in any loose ends.

EASY BASIC KNIT SCARF

Quick, easy pattern. Only one row to learn. Reversible and looks great.

CAST ON 26 stitches (make wider or narrower by adding or removing stitches in groups of 4)

ROW 1: * Knit 2, knit into the back of the next stitch, Purl 1. Repeat from * until there are 2 stitches left on needles. K2.

ROW 2 and beyond: Repeat that one row until your scarf is long enough. Cast off.

FLYING GEESE (from Sheri Biederman)

Reversible. Multiple of 12 stitches. 12 row pattern repeat. To get the proper width, Sheri added a border on each end. The border stitches were the garter stitch, i.e., K all border stitches. *Suggestion:* Knit a sample of the pattern, measure pattern, figure out how many more stitches are needed and add the additional garter stitches on each end.)

R1: * K1, P5, K5, P1 and repeat from *

R2: * K2, P4, K4, P2 and repeat from *

R3: * K3, P3 repeat from *

R4: * K4, P2, K2, P4 and repeat from *

R5: * K5, P1, K1, P5 and repeat from *

R6: * K6, P6, repeat from *

R7: * K5, P1, K1, P5 and repeat from *

R8: * K4, P2, K2, P4 and repeat from *

R9: * K3, P3 and repeat from *

R10: * K2, P4, K4, P2 and repeat from *

R11: * K1, P5, K5, P1 and repeat from *

R12: * K6, P6, repeat from *

PARALLELOGRAM PATTERN (Sheri Biederman)

R1: * K1, P5, K5, P1 and repeat from *

R2: * K2, P4, K4, P2 and repeat from *

R3: * K3, P3 repeat from *

R4: * K4, P2, K2, P4 and repeat from *

R5: * K5, P1, K1, P5 and repeat from *

R6-R8: * K6, P6, repeat from *

R9: * P1, K5, P5, K1 and repeat from *

R10: * P2, K4, P4, K2 and repeat from *

R11: * P3, K3 and repeat from *

R12: * P4, K2, P2, K4 and repeat from *

R13: * P5, K1, P1, K5 and repeat from *

R14-R16: * P6, K6 and repeat from *



KNIT | SKILL LEVEL: **EASY**

ABBREVIATIONS

Alt = Alternate(ing)

K = Knit

K2tog = Knit 2 stitches together

P = Purl

Rep = Repeat

RS = Right side

Ssk = Slip next 2 stitches knitwise one at a time. Pass them back onto left-hand needle, then knit through back loops together
St(s) = Stitch(es)

SIZES

To fit head sizes **2/4 yrs** (8/10 yrs-Adult).

GAUGE

18 sts and 24 rows = 4" [10 cm] in stocking stitch with larger needles.

INSTRUCTIONS

The instructions are written for smaller size. If changes are necessary for larger size the instructions will be written thus ().

With smaller needles, cast on **70** (74-78) sts.

1st row: (RS). K1. *K2. P2. Rep from * to last st. K1.

2nd row: P1. *K2. P2. Rep from * to last st. P1.

Rep last 2 rows (K2. P2) ribbing until work from beg measures **4 (5-6)"** [10 (12.5-15) cm], ending on a 2nd row.

Change to larger needles and proceed in stocking st until work from beg measures **6½ (7½-8½)"** [16.5 (19-21.5) cm], ending on a purl row.

Shape crown: 1st row: (RS). K1. *K2tog. K13 (14-15). ssk. Rep from * to last st. K1. **62 (66-70)** sts.

2nd and alt rows: Purl.

3rd row: K1. *K2tog. K11 (12-13). ssk. Rep from * to last st. K1. **54 (58-62)** sts.

5th row: K1. *K2tog. K9 (10-11). ssk. Rep from * to last st. K1. **46 (50-54)** sts.



MATERIALS

Caron® Kindness™ (7 oz/198 g; 345 yds/315 m)

Sizes 2/4 yrs 8/10 yrs Adult

Smoke (53012) 1 1 1 ball
or Tomato (53010)

Sizes U.S. 7 (4.5 mm) and U.S. 8 (5 mm) knitting needles or size needed to obtain gauge.

7th row: K1. *K2tog. K7 (8-9).
 ssk. Rep from * to last st. K1.
 38 (42-46) sts.

9th row: K1. *K2tog. K5 (6-7).
 ssk. Rep from * to last st. K1.
 30 (34-38) sts.

11th row: K1. *K2tog. K3 (4-5).
 ssk. Rep from * to last st. K1.
 22 (26-30) sts.

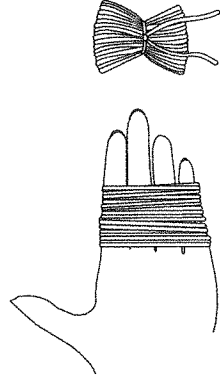
13th row: K1. *K2tog. K1 (2-3).
 ssk. Rep from * to last st. K1.
 14 (18-22) sts.

Size Adult only: 14th row: Purl.

15th row: K1. *K2tog. K1. ssk. Rep
 from * to last st. K1. 14 sts.

All Sizes: Break yarn, leaving a
 long end. Thread end through
 rem 14 (18-14) sts. Draw up
 and fasten securely. Sew back
 seam, reversing halfway through
 ribbing for turnback cuff.

Pompom: Wind yarn around
 4 fingers approx 80 times.
 Remove from fingers and tie
 tightly in center. Cut through
 each side of loops. Trim to a
 smooth round shape. Sew to top
 of Hat.



Yarnspirations

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KNIT SKILL LEVEL: BEGINNER

SIZES

To fit average head sizes:

Child 4/6 yrs (Child 8-10 yrs/
Adult).

GAUGE

9 sts and 18 rows = 4" [10 cm] in
garter st.



MATERIALS

Bernat® Softee® Chunky™ (3.5 oz/100 g; 108 yds/99 m)

Sizes	4/6 yrs	8-10 yrs	Adult
True Grey (28044) or Grey Rag (28047)	1	1	1 ball

Size U.S. 11 (8 mm) knitting needles or size needed to obtain gauge.

ABBREVIATIONS:

Beg = Beginning	Rep = Repeat
K = Knit	RS = Right side
K2tog = Knit next 2 stitches together	St(s) = stitch(es)
Rem = Remaining	WS = Wrong side

INSTRUCTIONS

The instructions are written for smallest size. If changes are necessary for larger sizes the instructions will be written thus (). Numbers for each size are shown in the same color throughout the pattern. When only one number is given in black, it applies to all sizes.

Optional Pom-pom: Wind yarn around 4 fingers 80 times. Remove from fingers and tie tightly in center. Cut through each side of loops. Trim to a smooth round shape. Sew to top of Hat.



Shape crown: 1st row: (RS), *K2, K2tog. Rep from * to last st. K1. 28 (31-34) sts.

2nd row: Knit.

3rd row: *K1, K2tog. Rep from * to last st. K1. 19 (21-23) sts.

4th row: Knit.

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
